

## Camp Meadowood Springs

### Speech and Language Summer Camp

<b>Job Title:</b>	Supervising Clinician - Camp Meadowood
<b>Job Summary:</b>	Supervise student clinicians in all aspects of therapeutic intervention to allow for a successful experience for campers with communication disorders in the camp environment.
<b>Supervisor:</b>	University Clinical Coordinator, Meadowood Clinical Director
<b>Qualifications:</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. ASHA-certified SLPs (CCC-SLP)</li> <li>2. Licensed in the State of Oregon</li> <li>3. At least 5 years experience as a licensed SLP, preferred</li> <li>4. Have earned at least two hours of professional development in supervision and/or clinical instruction (ASHA requirement for all supervising clinicians)</li> <li>5. Must pass a criminal background check</li> <li>6. Current first aid/CPR certification</li> <li>7. Must reside on-site in a cabin during staff training and throughout the duration of camp (adult cabin, not with campers).</li> </ol>
<b>Responsibilities:</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Communicate and collaborate with the Clinical Director prior to camp to plan Student Clinician training.</li> <li>2. Lead at least one virtual, Student Clinician specific training prior to camp.</li> <li>3. Co-lead (with Meadowood Clinical Director and Camp Director) one virtual staff training prior to camp.</li> <li>4. Coordinate with the University program about supervision requirements prior to camp.</li> <li>5. Conduct file reviews of all registered campers; contact and communicate with their families as necessary regarding therapeutic goals and other intervention tools/devices (i.e. hearing aids, picture cues, social stories, AAC devices)</li> <li>6. Arrive on-site with the camp Leadership Team (3 days prior to the start of camp); Participate in Camp Leadership meetings throughout camp as deemed necessary</li> <li>7. Provide training to Student Clinicians in foundational therapy skills (file review, goal writing, data collection, progress report writing)</li> <li>8. Assist Student Clinicians in planning therapy and implementing therapy in the camp environment</li> <li>9. Supervise Student Clinicians during camp; Participate with Student Clinicians in camp designated camp activities</li> <li>10. Give constructive daily feedback to Student Clinicians</li> <li>11. Complete all paperwork for Student Clinician supervision for the University program</li> </ol>
<b>Compensation:</b>	Compensation is provided by the partnering University. Camp Meadowood provides room and board during staff training and the camp session.

<b>Status:</b>	Seasonal (trainings in June, camp in July)
